Program Goals: to increase access to services for OUD, reduce unmet treatment need, and reduce opioid overdose related deaths through the provision of prevention, treatment, and recovery activities.

Specialized Services:

- Peer-Support Groups (Includes CRAFT-based Skills Training)
- Individual Supportive Counseling
- Case Management Services
- Psycho-education
- Referrals to additional resources and wraparound services

- To improve the functioning of family members by making positive life changes.
